

- Refreshed Perspective and Mental Acuity—occupy your free time.
 Published studies from the Baltimore Experience Corps Trial showed that older adults volunteering in the classroom helped support certain mental tasks like "executive function" or brain activity in key areas of the brain.
- Effective Pain Remedy—people with chronic conditions say volunteering helps them manage these conditions. It appears that giving back could serve as an important stress reliever and distraction for older adults suffering from various chronic conditions such as arthritis, diabetes and high blood pressure.
- Invigorated Social Networks—There's no time when the risk of isolation is as great as in our older years. Volunteering gives many older adults a reason to walk out the door each morning.
- Better Mental Outlook—Depression is among the biggest challenges faced by older adults who have lost spouses or whose families have moved away or are too busy for them. Nearly 3/4 of the participants say volunteering can help.
- Long-Lasting Legacies
 — Volunteers say that they learned the importance of volunteering from their parents' community service and 84 percent say they have encouraged their children to give back to their communities.

- Strengthened Mission—make a difference, Whether it's passing out lunches at a school program or volunteering at a food drive, nearly all senior volunteers want to make a difference.
- Improved Physical Health—stay active and feel better physically.
 Recent research confirms what other studies have revealed: giving back pays special dividends in increased activity, which often results in improved health.
- Stronger Emotional Foundation—feel better emotionally. Perhaps it's
 the idea of putting others' needs before one's own, but older volunteers
 almost always feel better emotionally.
- Renewed Spiritual Purpose—gain a sense of purpose. Along with a need to make a difference, older adult volunteers overwhelmingly want to gain a sense of purpose.
- Shared wisdom—share your talents, skills and experience. Many older adults have spent a lifetime in careers or honing domestic and creative skills that they are more than happy to share with others.

Household Hazardous Waste

Many products we use are considered hazardous waste because they contain corrosive, toxic, flammable ingredients, or materials that react in harmful ways when combined with other materials. These products require special care when being disposed of. Once a year the Regional Service Commission holds a Household Hazardous Waste day where residents can safely and responsibly dispose of these items.

If a product's label indicates that it is toxic, corrosive, flammable or indicates caution or warning messages, then the products should be treated with care when in use and at time of disposal. Examples can include:

- · Stains & varnishes
- Pesticides & herbicides
- Fertilizers
- Cleaning products
- · Fluorescent light bulbs
- Propane tanks and cylinders
- Mercury thermometers
- · Pool chemicals
- · Drain and oven cleaners
- Solvents
- · Upholstery cleaners
- · Gas

These items should never be poured down drains, buried, burned or placed with your regular waste.



Household Recycling

Since 2001 Western Valley residents have had access to recycling via our blue depot bins located throughout the region. 

In a medical emergency, always call 911.

When you call 911, your call is answered at one of the provincial 911 Public Safety Answering Points. If you are in medical distress, your call will be transferred to Ambulance New Brunswick's dispatch centre, which operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. An emergency medical dispatcher will ask you some questions to ensure the ambulance is responding to the correct location, and to better understand the patient's medical condition. While you are giving information to the dispatcher, another dispatcher is sending the ambulance and relaying the information you provide to the paramedics. Should your emergency require any lifesaving instructions, the dispatcher you are talking to will provide those directions over the phone.



Property Tax Allowance Program

The Property Tax Allowance gives a tax break to low income property owners. To qualify you must own your property, it must be your principal residence, and you must be receiving the Residential Property Tax Credit.

If you and your spouse have a combined taxable income of:

- less than \$22,000, you are eligible for up to a \$300 rebate.
- Between \$22,001 and \$25,000, you are eligible for up to a \$200 rebate.
- Between \$25,001 and \$30,000, you are eligible for up to a \$100 rebate.

Fire Safety Tips for Older Adults

- Never smoke in bed.
- 2. Never run electrical cords under a carpet or rug, and avoid using extension cords with space heaters or electric blankets.
- 3. Before using portable space heaters ensure that you have at least three feet of clearance between the heater and combustibles
- 4. Do not use a dishtowel as a potholder.
- 5. Loose clothing is a serious burn hazard roll up your sleeves and ensure that other pieces of clothing are kept well away from hot stovetop elements.
- 6. Install a working smoke alarm on every floor in your home and outside your sleeping area. Ask a friend or relative to test your smoke alarm while you are asleep. If it can't wake you it can't save you!
- 7. Install a working Carbon Monoxide (CO) detector in your home
- 8. Test the battery in your smoke alarms and CO detectors once a month..
- 9. Never disconnect your smoke alarms or CO detectors for any reason.
- 10. Plan and practise an escape plan in case of fire. It will reduce panic and confusion in an emergency and may save your life!
- 11. Make sure you can unlock all doors and open all windows. Know how to safely escape from all levels of your home.
- 12. Know two ways out of every room.
- 13. React Fast to Fire! Get Out and Stay Out!





Take part in at least 2.5 hours of moderate- to vigorous-intensity aerobic activity each week. 2

Spread out the activities into sessions of 10 minutes or more.

It is beneficial to add muscle and bone strengthening activities using major muscle groups at least twice a week. This will help your posture and balance.

Lived or Living Outside Canada (International Benefits)

If you have lived or worked in Canada and in another country, or you are the survivor of someone who has lived or worked in Canada and another country, you may be eligible for pensions and benefits from Canada and/or from the other country because of a social security agreement. A social security agreement is an international agreement between Canada and another country that is designed to coordinate the pension programs of the two countries for people who have lived or worked in both countries. The requirements under the social security agreement vary from agreement to agreement. It is important to check the details of the agreement that relates to you. Pensions in Canada and Related Benefits

The Old Age Security (OAS) pension is a monthly payment available to seniors aged 65 and older who meet the Canadian legal status and residence requirements. In addition to the OAS pension, there are three types of OAS benefits:

Guaranteed Income Supplement

If you live in Canada and you have a low income, this monthly non-taxable benefit can be added to your OAS pension.

Allowance

If you are 60 to 64 years of age and your spouse or common-law partner is receiving the OAS pension and is eligible for the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS), you might be eligible to receive this benefit.

Allowance for the Survivor

If you are 60 to 64 years of age and you are widowed, you might be eligible to receive this benefit.
